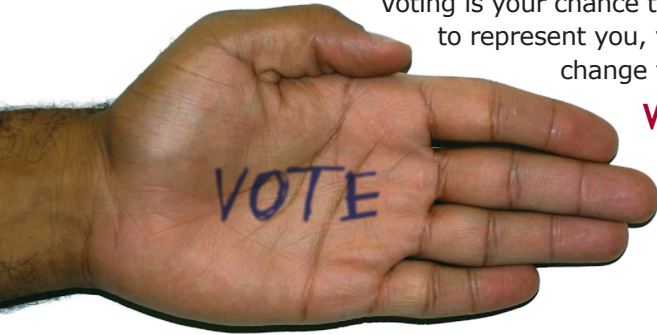

Your voice. Your vote.



Voting is your chance to be heard. It gives you the opportunity to choose leaders to represent you, your family and your community. Voting is your chance to change the future.

Who can vote?

You can vote in Minnesota if you:

- Are a U.S. citizen
- Are age 18 or older by November 4, Election Day
- Have lived in Minnesota for at least 20 days right before Election Day

You have the right to vote even if you don't read, write or speak English.

How can I vote?

If you're not already registered at your current address, you can register on Election Day.

- Bring a Minnesota driver's license, learner's permit, Minnesota State ID or tribal ID with your current address.
- If your identification doesn't show your current address, bring a voter registered in the precinct where you live to vouch for you.
- Or bring your identification (U.S. passport, military ID or student ID from a Minnesota post-secondary institution) **and** a utility bill for electric, gas, water, solid waste, sewer, phone, or cable TV due within 30 days of Election Day. The utility bill must show your name and current address.

You can bring an interpreter or other person into the voting booth with you.
